Inleiding

Op 27 mei 2006 werd het Indonesische eiland Java getroffen door een aardbeving, waarbij Imogiri, een van de dorpen (desa's) die door de Stichting Tileng wordt ondersteund, vrijwel geheel werd verwoest. De stichting heeft uiteraard onmiddellijk alle mogelijke steun toegezegd bij de wederopbouw. Het medeleven vanuit de achterban van de stichting, veelal vergezeld van een financiële bijdrage, was hartverwarmend. Van groot belang was hierbij ook de bijdrage van EUR 65.000 van de Gemeente Capelle aan den IJssel. Deze brede steun gaf de stichting de mogelijkheid om een wezenlijke bijdrage te leveren aan de herbouw van Imogiri en aan het economisch en sociaal herstel.

Sinds de start van de herbouw is nu bijna een jaar verlopen en is het dan ook hoog tijd om een ieder die hieraan heeft bijgedragen op de hoogte te stellen van de stand van zaken in Imogiri op dit moment. Met een zekere trots presenteert de Stichting Tileng hierbij dan ook het eerste verslag van hetgeen in eendrachtige samenwerking met de lokale bevolking inmiddels is bereikt.



Eerste hulp

De Stichting Tileng houdt zich bezig met projecten die structurele verbeteringen bewerkstelligen. De eerst periode na de aardbeving was de nood in Imogiri echter zo hoog, dat besloten werd waar nodig ook noodhulp te verlenen. De noodhulp werd geleverd door de vertegenwoordigers van de stichting uit Baturraden. Deze waren op verzoek van de stichting direct afgereisd naar Imogiri.



Tijdens het bezoek van het bestuur van de stichting aan de desa in juli 2006 is ter plaatse nieuw individueel schoolmateriaal aangeschaft voor een groep van 159 leerlingen.

Kleuterschool

Op 26 mei 2006 kregen wij het verslag binnen van de feestelijke oplevering van de met steun van de Stichting Tileng gebouwde kleuterschool. Op 27 mei was er de aardbeving en was de school niet meer te gebruiken, te gevaarlijk. Inmiddels is de school volledig hersteld en waar nodig herbouwd. Op 2 mei jongstleden is de school (weer) feestelijk in gebruik genomen.

PROJECT REPORT TK PKK 36 IMOGLI RENOVATION'S PROJECT

TK PKK 36 Imogiri is a kindergarten which was renovated by the Stichting Tileng Foundation. This school also damage because of the earthquake of May 27th, 2006 and need a renovation. Stichting Tileng foundation once again has already agreed to renovate this school. Right now this school is finish from its renovation and the students get a nice place to study again. The opening of this re-new TK was also attended by the Bantul's Deputi wife, also the Deputi of Imogiri district and the administrator of the village. They are so proud because Stichting Tileng helped the people in Imogiri. This project report contain some of the picture from the renovation's result and the financial review, also some pictures from the grand opening of the TK.

Overall, we are renovating almost the whole parts of the school, make it strong and better, and add some other parts too. These are the result of the school that we've been renovated:

1. The school's building

We give a better construction for the building; also put the fibre roof in front of the school because some of the playing tools are placed in front of the school so the children will get some protection from the sunlight too when they are playing around, just like at the playground in the left side of the school.



2. The classroom

We have already repaired and make the construction of the wall stronger. We also give new tables and chairs for the student, put a ceramic floor for the classrooms, repair the roof and put a new ceiling for it.

This new library was built at the right side of the school, above the well that has been closed down. So, the water need for the school is fulfilled from the water tank near the school. This library also has a small area in it for praying (small mosque).

The grand opening of the school

The grand opening is the most excitement moment for the whole society in our village at that day. All of the people here are gathering together, working and help each other for this event, cooking the food, preparing the place, and some other things needed for the event. We were inviting the people from the governmental sector, such as the village administrator, the Imogiri's District administrator, also the Deputy's wife of Bantul. We are so proud because they want to come to this event and see how's Stichting Tileng has helped the people in Imogiri. The children also performed some traditional dances for the guest. We get the fund for this event from the whole society in our village. They collect money voluntarily to succeed this event.

Noodwoningen

In nauw overleg met de bevolking is de Stichting Tileng overgegaan tot de bouw noodwoningen. Het ontwerp was gebaseerd op de volgende uitgangspunten. De noodwoning kan veelal op de fundering van het voormalige huis gebouwd worden. Hierdoor kan men na enige tijd, indien men het geld hiervoor bij elkaar heeft, beginnen met de herbouw van de oude woning. De nieuwbouw kan om de noodwoning heen plaatsvinden. De noodwoningen hebben een totale oppervlakte van 28 m² (wonen/slaperen 24 m²) en worden gemaakt van gevlochten bamboematten. Deze bamboematten bieden de beste bescherming tegen de hevige regen in het regenseizoen. Daarnaast hebben de mensen de garantie dat een noodwoning van bamboematten 3 tot 4 jaar mee gaat. Aan de woning is een mandi (simpel wasgelegenheid van 4 m²) gebouwd, zodat de bewoners van de noodwoningen ook een goede sanitaire voorziening hebben.

Er zijn inmiddels 33 woningen opgeleverd en in gebruik genomen. Uit de gesprekken met bewoners en de foto's van de in gebruik genomen woningen blijkt dat de meeste bewoners een minder tijdelijk karakter aan de woning hebben gegeven en dat ze uitgaan van een langere gebruiksduur. Door de bouwwijze en de gebruikte materialen is dit zeker mogelijk. De bamboematten zijn zonodig eenvoudig en relatief goedkoop te vervangen.

Over de voortgang van de bouw is in diverse fases gerapporteerd. Hieronder volgt een selectie uit deze rapportages.

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The first model of the temporary house

Why do we put this first model of the temporary house in this report is because as you all know that for the other temporary house, we put some patterned woven bamboo for the front wall, and this first model was build with unpatterned woven bamboo for the front wall. So, we make it just the same like the other temporary houses by add a patterned woven bamboo for the front wall.



The 2nd house

This house is for Bapak Jadir and his family, at the last report I have already gave you the picture that the house is completely done, we just need to put the name board of Stichting Tileng at this house.



The 3rd house

This house for Ibu Reso is done too. Her daughter make this temporary house looks better only by their limit capability. Now she has live on it with her mother, they put a separator from some curtain inside to make a bedroom, and has a small area for a living room too inside, very nice =).

The 4th house

This house is for Ibu Trisno Harjono and her family like I've told you before and it's done too. They also put some separator from a board to make a bedroom.

The 5th house

This house is for Bapak Saidi, it's done too.

The 6th house

This house is for Ibu Yatmini and her family, has completely finish too. This family (and actually the other too...) want me to say thanks for you to help them with this house so they can live in it, cause there is no way they will be able to build their own house again after the earthquake.

The 7th house

This house is for Ibu Sri and her family, it's done too. She adds a small chamber next to this temporary house for a kitchen and bathroom. She also put a separator inside the house to make a bed room. This house looks great too.

The 8th house

This house is for Bapak Aton and his family. It's done and looks great too. They put a separator inside too; make a small garden in front of the house. Looks green, nice, ethnic, and great =).



Something that interesting here is a set of chair in that living room and the bamboo lamp. Yes they all made from bamboo, and guess who offering us and the people in my village those kind of chair and lamp? They are the workers from Purworejo that we've hired to build the temporary houses. Because they made that kind of stuff too, they are expert to make something with bamboo. So one day when they came with a lot of big bamboo and woven bamboo for the wall to build the temporary houses, they bought an example of that kind of stuff that is a set of chair and some bamboo lamp. And the price is good and cheap enough, and I guess it's becoming a kind of alternative for our society especially the one who lost their house, of course they won't have any chair too cause it has already broken by the earthquake. So, a lot of people in my village are interested and order that chair like this family, a lot of family in my village has that chair now.



The 9th house

This house is done too; it's for Bapak Sumadi and his family, the bricklayer who also help to build the first model of temporary house. He put ceramic floor too and painting the half wall by his own style and creativity.

The 10th house

The 10th house is for Bapak Tukino (the man at the picture), he is replacing Ibu Atik. I'm so sorry we can't show you the step by step phase for the building of this house like the other house, we just show you the final result, and we hope it won't be a problem.



The 11th house

This house is for Bapak Sucahyono and his family. He lives with his wife, his daughter, and his parents. The woman in the picture is his wife. This is the temporary house.



The 12th house

This house is for Bapak Yanto and his family. He lives with his wife and two kids. This is the temporary house.

The 13th house

The 13th house from the first period is for Bapak Saban and his family. He lives with his wife (the woman in the picture), his daughters, son-in-law, and two grandchildren. This is the temporary house.



The 14th house

This house is for Bapak Tudjiman and his family. His house is broken because of the earthquake and hasn't got a reconstruction fund from the government.



The 15th house

This temporary house is for Bapak Tutut and his family, their family is a simple and humble family. They are very thankful that Stichting Tileng help them with this temporary house.



The 16th house

The 16th house is for Bapak Budiman Subiyakto and his family. This temporary house also made with half brick stones wall, and they also add to put ceramics floor in this house.

The 17th house

This house is for Bapak Ngadiman and their family. He lives with his wife, son and daughter, also a grandchild.

The 18th house

This house is for Ibu Waganah and her family. She's make a traditional food, emping, for a living. She's an old lady that has to make a living for her family by her own.

The 19th house

This house is for Bapak Hadi Wiyana and his family. He lives with his wife and sons. He works as a mechanic in a small repair shop. He got no help either from the government for his broken house.

The 20th house

This house is for Bapak Wujiyono and his family. They are love to live in this house because they were never imagine that they will be able to have a house anymore after the earthquake happened, especially because they haven't get any help from the government.



The 21st house

This house is for Ibu Sarjinem and her family. She lives with her husband and sons.

The 22nd house

This house is for Bapak Parno and his family. He lives with his wife and child in this house.

The 23rd house

This house is for Bapak Budi Siswoyo and his family. He's make a living by selling some crispy chips in traditional market everyday.

The 24th house

This house is for Bapak Diyodikromo and his family. They are a family that lives in a low economic condition and we glad that Stichting Tileng gives an opportunity to help this family.

The 25th house

This house is for Bapak Suroso and his family. This family hasn't got a reconstruction fund from the government yet either.

The 26th house

This house is for Bapak Subarjo and his family.



The 27th house

This temporary house is for Bapak Haryono and his family. This temporary house was build above the foundation from the old house.



The 28th house

This house is for Bapak Muji Utomo and his family

The 29th house

This temporary house is for Bapak Agus and his family.

The 30th house

This house is for Ibu Suprih and her family. She is a widow that lives with her 2 kids.



The 31st house

This temporary house is for Bapak Trimo and his family. Before the earthquake happened he just finish building a house and suddenly the earthquake happened, and his house was gone, totally broken.

The 32nd house

This house is for Ibu Sri Hartati and her family. She lives with her husband and her two kids. Before this temporary house was build for them, they live in a tent.

The 33rd house

This last temporary house is for Bapak Kelik and his family.



Those houses have a different style, different theme, and different paint. Some of the people who get this house -who are able to- can put ceramics for the floor, put a half brick stones wall for the house and paint the wall with the colours they like, and make the house greats by adding something else. The other one can only paint the doors and the windows, put a separator inside it to make a room, or just put a curtain for the windows or put some accessories in front of the house, and some of them just receive the house the way it is because they are not able to put anything more. But it doesn't matter how far and how much they could make the house more beautiful, what does matter is that I finally realize that those houses you gave them is NOT just a temporary house, it's really a true house for them, some of them even can't build another house for their family again. From the way they're watching at the building of the house, the way they talk and smile to me or Puri when we came by to watching over the building or when I made some picture for the report, the way they did and gave anything they could give to support the building of the house, and from the way they decorate those houses by anything they can use, by their own creativity, I really can see it clearly. You don't have to be worried about whether they will take care of those houses or not because I believe, and I really can give you my word that they will take care of this house in a very good way. I think you have gave them something more than just 'temporary'. It's something 'permanent' and 'true'. The house is 'permanent and true' for them. Their happy, excited, and relieve feeling for having the house is completely 'permanent and true'. Really touch my heart. Thank you.

Bijdrage overheid

Bij de opzet van herbouwprojecten in Imogiri heeft de Stichting Tileng beperkt rekening gehouden met een bijdrage van de Indonesische overheid. Zoals nu blijkt is dat een verstandig uitgangspunt geweest. Bij de herbouw van woningen is door de overheid een zeer complex geheel van regels en voorwaarden opgesteld, waardoor er in de praktijk veel gezinnen van hulp verstoken zijn gebleven, terwijl anderen bijdragen hebben ontvangen die bij lange na niet voldoende waren voor reparatie of herbouw. De stichting zal hierbij dan ook blijven bijstaan tot iedereen een behoorlijk onderkomen heeft.

Bij de herbouw van scholen heeft de bijdrage van de Indonesische overheid een onverwachte wending genomen. Zij hebben reeds een aanvang genomen met de herbouw van de lagere school, die de stichting reeds in haar programma had opgenomen. Deze herbouw zal echter niet volledig zijn. De stichting heeft dan ook al toegezegd de herbouw en inrichting uiteindelijk te voltooien.

Tegenover deze meevalle staat het probleem dat een tweetal verwoeste kleuterscholen het waarschijnlijk geheel zonder overheidsbijdrage moeten doen. De stichting heeft daarom besloten om de middelen die vrij zijn gekomen door de overheidsbijdrage aan de lagere school te gebruiken om deze twee kleuterscholen te herbouwen.

Hieronder volgt een uittreksel van de betreffende aanvraag (TK=kleuterschool).

The earthquake that happened in Jogjakarta and Central java on May, 27th 2006 resulting a very big damage and destruction in most kind of public building, schools, and houses. Most of the houses (about 90 % from all of the houses) are falling down, falling apart, and has a severe damage, especially in Imogiri.

Almost all of the kindergarten (TK) in Imogiri got destruction from the earthquake too. There are 18 kindergartens in Imogiri including TK PKK 36 in Pajimatan, and the rest 17th TK's knowing that TK PKK 36 got a help from Stichting Tileng, and they really wish that their TK can get a help from Stichting Tileng too. After the earthquake happened in 2006, from the 18 kindergarten, we just find out that there are 2 TK's left who haven't got help from government or from any kind of foundation to rebuild their school that has already damage because of the earthquake. The 2 TK's are TK PKK Nogosari II Nawungan and TK PKK Kalidadap. This 2 TK's are located in the most southern area of Imogiri, a quite isolated place in a ridges area with a low economic condition from their society. Right now, the education process is done in a small mosque in their area. So, when we looking at their situation, we really wish that Stichting Tileng could help them to build their own building so the children can do their study in a quite comfort place, a real school.

The picture below show where the studying process is held everyday, in one part of a mosque.



Verantwoording

Uiteraard zijn de werkzaamheden nog in volle gang en zal het nog wel enige tijd duren voordat dit traject - hopelijk naar tevredenheid - kan worden afgesloten. Toch is het goed om met enige regelmaat te kijken hoe het er financieel voor staat.
